ALEX

Free radio and TV for all

ALEX is a non-commercial community radio and television in Berlin, funded by public radio fees. Community stations like Alex – formerly known as Open Channel Berlin - took root in many big cities in Germany when commercial cable TV was introduced in the 80s and 90s. Alex is meanwhile fully digital, available via cable, live stream and on YouTube. Reporting about parliamentary sessions as well as cultural events but keeping a focus on non-mainstream issues, Alex reaches 1,6 Million TV-viewers and 3 Million radio listeners. It has a training unit for lay journalists and community production workshops. The latest addition to ALEX is "Digga", a program for and by school students alex-berlin.de

Bezirksamt Neukölln A problem district changing

Neukölln is one of 12 boroughs ("Bezirke") of Berlin, each with its own local municipality ("Bezirksamt"). Neukölln, located in the southeast of the city, has a large number of immigrants. 40 per cent of the population of 310,000 are of non-German origin, man of them Turkish and Arabs. Neukölln became (in)famous in 2006 when an elementary school, the Rütli school, was declared unmanagable by its own teachers. This sparked a nationwide debate about school systems and violence. Meanwhile the school has been reformed and serves as a role model; 90 per cent of its students are still of non-German background. Like the school, Neukölln is rapidly changing with an influx of middle-class and creative people.

Neukoellner.net Famous, wild and unpaid

Just looking at the website you'll notice the difference: a translation bottom into eight languages, a vibrant yet clear lay-out, news sections imaginatively labelled "art & kitsch" and "power & fairy tales". No wonder, the hyper-local journalism site Neukoellner.net has been nominated for Grimme Online Awards 2015, a prestigious media price in Germany. The community neighbourhood platform bridges the gap between the immediacy of blogs and classic local journalism. A voluntary team of media professionals reports about art, politics, social issues, events and everything in between – receiving more than 12,000 clicks a day. And on 18 June 2015 they will know if they won the price!

Professional citizen participation

As soon as the word (and the idea) of citizen participation came up and administrations all over were wondering just how to do it, the Berlin-based agency of professionals around founder Matthias Trénel was born - offering their service since 2003. The agency manages everything from concept to design, technical development to communication issues, management to evaluation – always in projects tailored to give citizens more influence on political processes between elections. The agency has carried out 100 major projects such as school planning in Frankfurt, a participation-website for Bonn and gave people their say during the redesign of Berlin's centre Alexanderplatz. The team of 20 has one motto: "We love democracy."

Background informations

Berliner Senat Governing Germany's capital

Berlin is the capital of Germany and one of 16 states ("Bundesländer"), three of which are city states (Berlin, Hamburg, Bremen). With a population of 3.5 million people, Berlin is Germany's largest city. The Senate of Berlin is the city state government of Berlin with the mayor at the top and up to eight senators. It's like a cabinet and meets weekly at the Red Town Hall. Mayor and Senate are represented by one press department, responsible for press conferences, a daily news bulletin, the city's official website www.berlin.de and attending to information and interview requests of national and international press. Berlin was a divided city for 28 years, surrounded by communist Germany, the DDR. until the fall of the wall on 9 November 1989; reunification was completed one year later. Berlin's press speakers have had their fair share of problems recently, among them an ongoing airport scandal.

Potsdamer Neueste Nachrichten (PNN) Daily for sale, weekend for free

Potsdamer Neue Nachrichten (PNN) is one of two daily newspapers in this affluent and historical neighbourhood of Berlin. PNN has a female editor-in-chief, Sabine Schicketanz, a circulation of around 20 000 copies and is the sister publication of the famous liberal Berlin daily Tagesspiegel. The Sunday edition Potsdam am Sonntag is given out free to households and has a circulation of more than 120 000.

Background informations

Rathaus Potsdam Gem in the countryside

Potsdam is the capital of the federal state of Brandenburg with about 160 000 inhabitants and a 1000-year-history, the kings of Prussia once resided here. 15 per cent of the population are students in this beautiful lake and castle environment. Located only 24 kilometres southwest of Berlin's city center, Potsdam was a world apart during communism. Much of the historical buildings have been restored and Potsdam, now a UNESCO-site, is known for tackling local politics with a strong emphasis on citizen participation ("Bürgerbeteiligung"). It even has a local action plan against xenophobia. The movie Inglorious Bastards with Brad Pitt was filmed here, in the famous Babelsberg studios.

Hinz und Kunzt

A media project for and by the homeless

Established in 1993 as a joint project of homeless people and journalists, the idea was: Selling a professionally written and designed magazine with the aim to create money, recognition and dignity for the homeless. The magazine would also be a social voice in the city. Since then more than 17 million newspapers have been sold by more than 5000 homeless men and women; annually an average of about 64,000 copies per month. Hinz & Kunzt is the largest street magazine and among the first of its kind in Germany. Meanwhile, there are 26 street papers in German-speaking countries that are members of the global network INSP (International Network of Street Papers).

Der Spiegel/ Spiegel Online (SPON) Famous news magazine, popular news site

Der Spiegel is Germany's most famous and recognised weekly news magazine published in Hamburg. It is one of Europe's largest publications of its kind, but even fame and recognition have not spared it from experiencing the general decline of print. Today Spiegel sells 880 000 copies monthly, down from over a million copies before 2003, but it still reaches six million readers per month. Meanwhile, its news website SPON ranks as Germany's No. 1 and is said to make enough money from advertising to sustain a large staff. Experimenting with creative formats such as prominent columnists have helped.

So when the Hamburg district of Eimsbüttel got its own online magazine in 2013, it had to call itself Eimsbuetteler Nachrichten. The attractive news site with an ostrich in its logo is compiled, written and designed by a staff of more than thirty young journalists, photographers, graphic designers, IT-specialists. Why so many? Most of them hold other jobs since the hyper-local community magazine cannot sustain them yet. The editorial teams says: "We find our topics just in front of our doorstep." Eimsbütteler Bezirksamt Taking care of 250 000 versatile people

The district Eimsbüttel is one of 7 districts of Hamburg. And the port city Hamburg, way up north, is Germany's second largest city with a 1,8 million population. Eimsbüttel is home to the university. Because of its inner-city location media and creative industries are happy to call it their home. As other districts, Eimsbüttel has its own local administration, the "Bezirksamt", which is responsible for health, schooling, marriages, foreigners, social benefits, street repairs, dialogue with citizens, communication and anything else that matters to 250,000 inhabitants. With 18,000 people per square kilometre Eimsbüttel has one of the highest population densities in Germany.

It upholds the virtues of independent journalism but also stresses the need for "constant self-reflection and self-monitoring" of journalists.

Parliament watch does exactly that: watching state representatives, and watching them very closely. They follow up on promises made (all questions and answers are saved forever), learn and publish whatever they can find about extra earnings. Before elections (at state, federal and European level) the project is extended to include candidates running for election. For users none of these functions require prior registration and are free of charge. Parliament Watch is financed through memberships and donations. The website counts 6,800 visitors a day and about three million page impressions per month. Abgeordnetenwatch helped to start similar projects in France, Ireland, Greece and Tunisia – and is looking for interested partners in South Africa!
